ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Temple Christian School is a ministry of Cornerstone Baptist Temple. Since its establishment in 1968, the school has existed to encourage families fulfilling the biblical mandate to rear their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. The goal of Christian education is to develop the mind of Christ in each student. The purpose of Temple Christian is to support the family and the work of the local church. Temple Christian School believes and teaches the essential doctrines of the Christian faith as embraced by the historic, biblical, Baptist position.

Parents agreeing with the philosophy and seeking admission for their children to the school should proceed with the following:

- 1. Make an appointment to meet the principal and take a walk-through the buildings.
- 2. Complete and submit Registration Form.
- 3. Submit Pastoral Reference Form.
- 4. Submit a copy of student's most recent report card or transcript.
- 5. Set an appointment for the student to take a diagnostic assessment.
- 6. Pay Registration Fee (upon acceptance).

Temple Christian School Dress Code 2019-2020

Elementary School – Grade K4-6

General Guidelines for Boys and Girls

- All TCS students should exhibit modest and developmentally appropriate dress.
- All clothing should be tag/label and brand logo free.
- Form-fitting, tight-fitting, or baggy clothing is not permitted. Clothing must be loose-fitting.
- Body piercings are not permitted. (Girls can have up to two piercings per ear.)
- Body tattoos are not permitted.
- Students must stay in school uniform until school dismissal is complete (3:15).
- Students who go to late stay must stay in uniform.

Bottoms

- Colors are black, dark blue, or khaki only.
- Bottoms must not be tight, skinny, baggy, or clinging

Tops

- Polo shirts/blouses must be collared and solid color.
- Polo shirts/blouses must be buttoned within one button from the top.
- TCS approved logo is required.
- Layering with solid color long sleeved T's is permitted.
- TCS and CBT spirit wear is permitted on Fridays.
- Hooded sweatshirts, hooded sweaters, and hooded vests are not permitted in the classroom.

Shoes/Socks

- Dress or casual shoes are acceptable for daily wear.
- Athletic sneakers in any color are permitted.
- Shoes with lights, wheels, characters, spinners, or platforms are NOT permitted.
- Shoes are to be properly tied at all times. Velcro shoes are acceptable.
- Socks are required.

Chapel Dress

- Chapel has been changed from Thursday mornings to Wednesday mornings.
- Boys must wear a dress shirt and tie on the days we have Chapel.
- Girls are to dress nicely for chapel. Clothing worn for Chapel must meet or exceed the guidelines for daily uniform dress.
- Tennis shoes are NOT permitted for chapel but can be brought to change into after chapel.

Specific guidelines for Elementary School Girls

- Up to two piercings per ear is permitted.
- Simple jewelry is permitted.
- Excessive jewelry such as large hoop earrings, nose rings or piercings, excessive hand rings, excessive necklaces, excessive bracelets, or extra earrings are not permitted.
- Excessive make-up is not permitted.
- Unnaturally colored hair is not permitted.

Bottoms for Girls

- K4 and K5 girls are encouraged to wear shorts under their skirts.
- Jumpers, skirts, or culottes may be worn, and they must come to the bottom of the knee.
- No gauchos and no capri pants are permitted.
- Skirts without slits must be modest, loose fitting and come to the bottom of the knee.
- Skirts with slits must be modest, loose fitting and the slit must be no higher than the bottom of the knee.
- This rule also applies to cheerleading uniforms.

Shoes/Socks, Etc. for Elementary Girls

- Girls' shoes must be closed-toe and closed-heeled and no more than two inches high. This applies every day of the week.
- Knee socks, tights, or ankle socks in solid colors are permitted.
- Hair is expected to be clean, neat and not cover the eyes. Extreme design and unnaturally colored hair are NOT permitted.
- Hair ornaments must be modest, and colors must coordinate with school clothing.

Specific Guidelines for Elementary School Boys

- Boys must be clean-shaven.
- Boys must not have any piercings.
- Hair is expected to be clean and of modest length. Extreme design, unnaturally colored hair, sculpting, shaving, and spiking is Not permitted. (Example of extreme design would be Mohawks, etc.)

Tops for Boys

• Uniform shirts must be tucked inside the trousers.

Bottoms for Boys

- Pants that have belt loops must be worn with a belt.
- Athletic jogger pants or khaki jogger pants (pants with elastic around the ankles) are not permitted.

Temple Christian Dress Guidelines for Athletic Events

- TCS and CBT spirit wear is permitted.
- Full length athletic pants are permitted for boys. Sweatpants are not permitted.
- Girls' skirts must come to the bottom of the knee.
- Jean pants are permitted for boys.
- TCS elementary students are to follow this dress code when attending athletic events.

The guidelines described herein reflect Temple Christian School's philosophy that students should dress modestly and be neatly groomed.

We acknowledge the various styles of dress and the desire of students to dress "in style."

Junior High and High School – Grade 7 - 12

General Guidelines for Boys and Girls

- All TCS students should exhibit modest and developmentally appropriate dress.
- All clothing should be tag/label and brand logo free.
- Form fitting, tight fitting, or baggy clothing is not permitted. Clothing must be loose fitting.
- Body piercings are not permitted. (Girls can have up to two piercings per ear.)
- Body tattoos are not permitted.
- Students must stay in school uniform until school dismissal is complete (3:15).
- Students who go to late stay must stay in uniform.
- Students who have gym class must change into the required clothing for gym class.
- Students who have gym class must change back into uniform after gym class is over.
- Shorts for gym class must be loose-fitting and long (at least the bottom of the knee).
- Shirts for gym class must be solid color T shirts or TCS or CBT spirit wear.
- Athletic sweat pants are NOT permitted for girls for gym class although boys may wear them for their gym class.

Bottoms

- Colors are black, dark blue, or khaki only.
- Bottoms must NOT be tight, skinny, baggy, or clinging

Tops

- Polo shirts/blouses must be collared and solid color.
- Polo shirts/blouses must be buttoned within one button from the top.
- TCS approved logo is required.
- Layering with solid color long sleeved T's is permitted.
- TCS and CBT spirit wear is permitted on Fridays.
- Hooded sweatshirts, hooded sweaters, and hooded vests are not permitted in the classroom.

Shoes/Socks

- Dress or casual shoes are acceptable for daily wear. (This includes sandals for girls in Grades 7 - 12 except from Nov. 1 through March 31.)
- Flip flops are NOT permitted.
- Athletic sneakers in any color are permitted.
- Shoes with lights, wheels, characters, spinners, or platforms are NOT permitted.
- Shoes are to be properly tied at all times. Velcro shoes are acceptable.
- Socks are required.

Chapel Dress

- Chapel is usually held on Wednesday mornings.
- Boys must wear a dress shirt and tie on the days we have Chapel.
- Girls are to dress nicely for chapel. Clothing worn for Chapel must meet or exceed the guidelines for daily uniform dress.
- Tennis shoes are NOT permitted on chapel days.

Specific guidelines for Junior High and High School Girls

- Up to two piercings per ear are permitted.
- Simple jewelry is permitted.
- Excessive jewelry such as large hoop earrings, nose rings or piercings, excessive hand rings, excessive necklaces, excessive bracelets, or extra earrings are not permitted.
- Excessive make-up is not permitted.
- Unnaturally colored hair is NOT permitted.

Bottoms for Girls

• Skirts that are black, dark blue, or khaki may be worn but must come to the bottom of the knee.

No gauchos and no pants are permitted.)

- Skirts without slits must be modest, loose-fitting and long (to the bottom of the knee).
- Proper under garments must be worn to insure modesty.
- Skirts with slits must be modest and loose-fitting, and the slit must be no higher than the bottom of the knee.
- This rule also applies to cheerleading uniforms.

Shoes/Socks, Etc. for Junior High and High School Girls

- Girls' shoes must be no more than two inches high.
- Knee socks, tights, or ankle socks in solid colors are permitted.
- Hair is expected to be clean, neat and not cover the eyes. Extreme design and unnaturally colored hair are NOT permitted.
- Hair ornaments must be modest, and colors must coordinate with school clothing.

Specific Guidelines for Junior High and High School Boys

- Boys must be clean-shaven.
- Boys must not have any piercings.
- Hair is expected to be clean and of modest length. Extreme design, unnaturally colored hair, sculpting, shaving, and spiking are NOT permitted. (Example of extreme design would be Mohawks, etc.)

Tops for Boys

Temple Christian Dress Guidelines for Athletic Events

- TCS and CBT spirit wear is permitted.
- Full length athletic pants are permitted for boys. Sweatpants are not permitted.
- Girls' skirts must come to the bottom of the knee.
- Jean pants are permitted for boys.
- Jean skirts that are loose fitting and come to the bottom of the knee are permitted for girls.
- This dress code is to be followed by all TCS students, K4 Grade 12, when the students attend any TCS athletic events, home games or away games.

Guidelines for Preschool and Kindergarten

Preschool K4

- 1. Each child enrolled in K4 must be four years of age by September 30.
- 2. K4 is Monday Friday from 8:15 a.m. 2:50 p.m.
- 3. All children enrolled in K4 must be toilet trained and self–sufficient in the restroom. One complete outfit must be left at school for times when accidents do occur.
- 4. By using funds for snacks, as noted on the book list, the teachers will provide snacks daily.
- 5. Lunches will need to be packed or purchased in the school cafeteria.
- 6. K4 students will have a rest time each day. Each student will need a blanket. Other supplies may be needed as the classroom teacher dictates.
- 7. Students enrolled in the K4 program must begin the program at the beginning of the year. This is due to the type of program that is offered.
- 8. Copies of the student's birth certificate, social security card, and immunizations are required.

<u>Kindergarten</u>

- 1. Children must be five years of age by September 30 for the K5 program.
- 2. K5 is Monday Friday from 8:15 a.m. 2:50 p.m.
- 3. By using funds for snacks, as noted on the book list, the teachers will provide snacks daily.
- 4. Lunches will need to be packed or purchased in the school cafeteria.
- 5. Copies of the student's birth certificate, social security card, and immunizations are required.
